TERMS OF REFERENCE- Revised 8 May 2024

Hotel Services for OSI Aerial Overflights Field Test (AO-FT) in North-Central Province, Sri Lanka

1. INTRODUCTION

The Preparatory Commission for the Comprehensive Nuclear-Test-Ban Treaty Organization with its headquarters in Vienna (hereinafter referred to as “the Commission”) is the international organization mandated to establish the global verification system foreseen under the Comprehensive Nuclear-Test-Ban Treaty (CTBT), which is the Treaty banning any nuclear weapon test explosion or any other nuclear explosions. The Treaty provides for a global verification regime, including a network of 321 stations worldwide, a communication system, an International Data Centre and On-site Inspections (OSI) to monitor compliance with the Treaty. In preparation for the On-Site Inspection Exercise Programme for 2022-2025 (CTBT/PTS/INF.1613) Integrated Field Exercise in 2025 (IFE25), to be conducted in Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka, the Preparatory Commission will conduct an OSI Communications and Data Transmission Field Test (COMSDT FT) at the Sri Lanka Air Force Base Hingurakgoda in **November** 2024.

These Terms of Reference (hereinafter referred to as “ToR”) describe the requirements for hotel services (accommodation, catering and meeting facilities) for the COMSDT-FT in **November** 2024 for the Comprehensive Nuclear-Test-Ban Treaty Organization (hereinafter referred to as “the Commission”).

The Provider shall carry out the Services in accordance with the requirements specified in these ToR in the most cost-effective manner possible.

2. REQUIRED SERVICES

General facility requirements

Parking	▪ Secure, private parking spaces for up to 4 vehicles available
Staff	▪ The provider shall appoint a Point of Contact for enquiries and coordination. ▪ Staff shall be able to support participants in their requests in adequate English.
Payment for additional services	▪ The provider should be able to arrange separate payment of any extra charges directly from the participant for any additional services not covered by the Commission (minibar, spa treatments, additional beverages or consumption).

Accommodation and Catering requirements

Booking flexibility:

The Commission reserves the right to request modifications to the requirements outlined above from the contracted provider, within the contractual framework and subject to availability. It shall endeavour to communicate the final requirements to the supplier 30 days before arrival.

Meeting room requirements

Capacity	Up to 11 participants, layout to be confirmed
Connectivity	Unlimited high-speed wired and/or wireless internet in meeting facilities
Equipment	Projector or large monitor, flipchart and pens

Cleaning	Daily cleaning of meeting facilities and supply still drinking water and glasses as required.
