1. Background

The Preparatory Commission for the Comprehensive Nuclear-Test-Ban Treaty Organization (hereinafter also referred to as "CTBTO") with its headquarters in Vienna is the International Organization mandated to establish the global verification system foreseen under the Comprehensive Nuclear-Test-Ban Treaty (hereinafter also referred to as "CTBT"), which is the Treaty banning any nuclear weapon test explosion or any other nuclear explosions. The Treaty provides for a global verification regime, including a network of more than 320 stations worldwide, a communication system, an International Data Centre and on-site inspections (hereinafter also referred to as "OSI") to monitor compliance with the Treaty. More information on the CTBTO can be found at: www.ctbto.org.

The OSI Division is tasked with the establishment of the OSI regime by the Treaty's entry-into-force. This includes development of OSI operational capabilities, including the establishment of an inspectorate training programme that prepares a multi-disciplinary team to conduct an on-site inspection within tight treaty timelines. Methodologies utilized in the training of surrogate inspectors include the use of e-learning and e-training tools, classroom-based presentations, tabletop exercises, station rotations and field exercises.

The OSI Training section is currently preparing a surrogate Inspection Team (hereinafter also referred to as "IT") for the upcoming Integrated Field Exercise 2025 (hereinafter also referred to as "IFE25"). OSI IFEs are amongst the largest and most technically complex multi-national exercises in the world. They are designed to test the application of virtually all OSI techniques, mechanisms, systems, and procedures against a technically realistic, scientifically credible scenario. Moreover, all four OSI phases, namely launch, pre-inspection, inspection, and post-inspection, are included in the IFE. IFE25 will be the third such exercise conducted by the organization. The first was in Kazakhstan in 2008, and the second in Jordan in 2014.

2. Objective of the Project

Terms of Reference (hereinafter also referred to as "ToR") describe the requirements for development and delivery of the Analysis and Decision-Making in Asymmetric Environments Course for the Inspection Team (hereinafter also referred to as the "Course") to be provided at the CTBTO's training facility in Seibersdorf, Austria. The Contractor shall carry out the services in accordance with the requirements specified in this ToR document in the most cost-effective and timely manner possible.

The required Course is a core component of the IFE25 Preparatory Training and shall include topics covering decision-making, delegation and security and crisis management in asymmetric environments. These accrued skills will enhance the Trainees' leadership, planning and operational capacities and furnish individual team member with the requisite tools to successfully navigate crisis situations.

The purpose of the Course is to provide skills and competencies that will increase the Trainees' cognitive and reasoning processes within a dynamic, fast-moving, international verification type context. The on-site verification setting is unique in that it places an inspection team in a highly pressurised, controlled field environment, counter to a sometimes combative and obstructive host country state.

The Trainees are Inspection Team and Leadership group of a multi-cultural cohort with broad technical or administrative backgrounds and varying degrees of operational field deployment experience. The Course shall be delivered in English. It shall be considered by the Trainer while developing and delivering the Course that a majority of the group are not English native speakers.

3. Scope and Deliverables

The Contractor shall provide a Trainer that has extensive and related experience in an arms control, disarmament and/or verification field environment to develop and deliver the Course, as per requirements specified in the Section 4 below.

The Trainer shall:

- Have online kick-off meeting with the OSI Training Focal Point (estimate workload: 1 hour);
- Develop and provide draft course materials (slides with notes, hand-outs and reference documents) based on agreed schedule and selected topics;
- In close collaboration with OSI Training Focal Point prepare the training material relevant to the OSI context;
- Attend online follow-up meetings with the OSI Training Focal Point, as required, prior to an in-person training in Seibersdorf to ensure the quality and relevance of the training material prepared (estimated workload: up to 4 hours);
- Provide final course materials package (slides with notes, hand-outs and reference documents)
 for OSI Training Focal Point confirmation at least two weeks before the in-person training delivery;
- Provide in-person Course on Analysis and Decision-Making in Asymmetric Environments within the OSI context; and
- A session on Security & Crisis Management (a part of the Course) shall be delivered separately, as outlined in the table below.

- OSI context and relevant examples that could be used in the preparation of the sessions.

4. Required Qualifications and Technical Skills

The Contractor shall have the following qualifications:

- a. At least 5 years of experience in delivering professional training services in arms control and/or disarmament verification work environment, or similar topics.
- b. Min 5 years of experience working and delivering training or workshops with the UN and other internal organization(s).
- c. Proven track of training delivered of quality (certification, training/workshop evaluation results, customer satisfaction reports or quotes, etc.), or similar.

The above qualifications shall be demonstrated in the company's profile information which submission is mandatory.

The proposed Trainer shall have the following qualifications:

- d. At least 10 years of proven operational field deployments in a disarmament, verification, non-proliferation setting, or similar.
